Who We Are: Photographs by Martin Jenkinson

24 Nov 2018 - 14 Apr 2019 Weston Park Museum

For over four decades Sheffield-based photojournalist Martin Jenkinson chronicled the drama and detail of our everyday lives.

During the 1980s, Jenkinson became known for his memorable images of British protests which were widely published in the national press. While these photographs became a familiar presence on the front pages, Jenkinson's wider work was no less powerful. Each of the images he created was a candid insight into the communities we're part of and the experiences we share.

Who We Are is the first major retrospective of Martin Jenkinson's work. Offering a sometimes moving, sometimes humorous window onto the city's character, his insightful photographs of Sheffield and its people will go on display alongside some of his most famous protest images, travel photography and more.


Wilhelmina Barns-Graham: Sea, Rock, Earth and Ice

Sea, Rock, Earth and Ice celebrates Wilhelmina Barns-Graham's remarkable gift for capturing the spirit of the world's wildest landscapes.

The exhibition brings together paintings and works on paper spanning four decades, illustrating how Barns-Graham developed her own abstract language informed by both international and local artistic influences.

The works on display are underpinned by an inherent understanding of the natural world and showcase Barns-Graham's extraordinary ability to evoke a landscape in gradual flux, from eroding coastlines and volcanic vistas to the unseen slow creep of a glacier.

With much of his life's work unrealised or destroyed, Leonardo's greatest achievements are represented through his drawings.
