## Lines of Beauty: Master Drawings from Chatsworth

14 Feb–25 May 2020  
Millennium Gallery

The Devonshire collection of Old Master Drawings is amongst the finest in the world. Spanning 300 years, these unparalleled works represent some of the true masters of their craft, including Carpaccio, Poussin, Rembrandt, Rubens, Van Dyck and more.

*Lines of Beauty* has been created in partnership with Chatsworth to showcase over 50 highlights from the collection. Amassed by the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Dukes of Devonshire, these drawings were originally reserved for the social elite of the time.

Today, the works form part of regular changing public displays at their Chatsworth home, but due to their delicate nature, opportunities to show them together remain limited.

This major exhibition, bringing together portraiture, landscapes, classical and religious narratives, is the largest display of the drawings in more than 20 years.

## Loved&Lost

When we lose someone close to us the grief we experience can be overwhelming. The *Loved&Lost* project helps people engage with their loss and remember those who meant so much to them.

Created by photographer Simon Bray after the death of his father, *Loved&Lost* invites people to find a family photograph, then return to the location to re-create it and record a conversation about the experience.

The process offers them a way to acknowledge their loss, to share the stories of these precious moments and celebrate those who are no longer with us.

Lorna May Wadsworth is one of Sheffield's real artistic success stories. During her 25-year career she's captured an array of famous faces from the worlds of politics, entertainment and beyond.

This winter, Lorna returns home for a retrospective that brings together more than 100 of her most acclaimed portraits.

Explore a visual feast of paintings of celebrated sitters, including actors David Tennant, Michael Sheen and Derek Jacobi, filmmaker Richard Curtis, author Neil Gaiman, politicians David Blunkett and Tony Blair, former Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams, and many more.

## Richard Bartle: Nomadic Tales

When artist Richard Bartle discovered the drawings of Siyah Kalem, or Black Pen, 15 years ago, it began an enduring fascination. He became captivated by these 14th century images which had traversed the borders of Iran, Turkey, China and Mongolia.

The drawings, depicting demons, nomadic lifestyles and ancient cultures, inspired Bartle to spend long periods living and working in Istanbul. In this exhibition, Bartle, like many storytellers before him, explores the power of myth to span cultural boundaries, reframing the images through the visual symbolism he observed in the contemporary city.

## Invisible Wounds: Landscape and Memory in Photography

When traumatic events, like conflict or destruction, occur in our fields, streets and cities, the memory of them remains long after the visible traces have gone.

Curated in partnership with Amanda Crawley Jackson from the University of Sheffield, *Invisible Wounds* shows how artists represent the echoes of these devastating acts that continue to haunt the landscapes in which they took place.

These evocative, arresting photographs by Chloe Dewe Mathews, Simon Norfolk, Zineb Sedira and more blur the boundaries between documentary and the work of the imagination to explore how the past lingers in the present.

### **NEW Ancient Egypt gallery at Weston Park Museum**

The city's collection of Egyptian artefacts has always been a real favourite with visitors to Weston Park Museum. Now they have a brand new home, thanks to a major grant from the DCMS/Wolfson Museums and Galleries Improvement Fund.

The new gallery, which opens at the museum in February, sees the popular Egyptian mummies become the centrepiece of dazzling new exhibits exploring the wonders of Ancient Egypt. Visitors to the gallery will see much more of the Egyptology collection on display and have the chance to find out what life at the time was really like.

*Ancient Egypt* is the first of two new galleries opening at Weston Park Museum in 2020, with *Sheffield Stories* set to follow in the spring.
